SHOW REGULATIONS

- The date of the Spring Show will be Saturday 3rd March 2012
- The exhibits must be the bona-fide property of, and in the possession of the exhibitor three months prior to the date of the show (excluding floral art).
- Exhibitors eligible to compete for members' prizes must be paid up members prior to the show.
- An exhibitor may not make more than two entries in any class. Joint entries are not accepted.
- Entry fees are 20p per entry; children's classes are free.
- Entries must be received by 9:00pm on the Wednesday prior to the show. No entries will be accepted after this time, including on the day of the show. EXCLUDING CHILDREN'S CLASSES
- Exhibitors entering any class and finding they are unable to compete must notify the Show Secretary asap.
- In all classes of bulbs, flowers and plants, exhibits should have the variety name displayed. If you are unsure of the variety put "unknown variety" and place in front of the display.
- The Committee reserves the right to inspect at any time intended exhibits entered for competition and the inspectors must see all the blooms on the plants. The committee has the power to reject/decline any exhibit it deems unsuitable.
- Staging of entries may take place on the Friday evening preceding the show between 7:30pm and 9:00pm and on the morning of the show between 8:00am and 10:30am, after which time all exhibitors must retire unless officially retained by the Show Secretary. During judging no person may enter the hall unless officially required by the Show Secretary.
- Exhibitors' slips, which will be issued by the Show Secretary, must be displayed face down with exhibits. Failure to display slips and / or display slips correctly will result in disqualification.
- Only Show Stewards and Officials are allowed to move exhibits already staged.
- Points awarded for classes are as follows:

	1 st	2 nd	3 rd
Collection classes	9	6	3
Other classes	3	2	1

If there is a tie for most points, the competitor with the most first prizes, will be deemed the winner.

- Objections (if any) must be made in writing to the Show Secretary before 3.30pm and must be accompanied by a deposit of £1.00, which will be refunded, if the objection is sustained.
- The judges are empowered to withhold any prize or prizes where the exhibits are considered unworthy of a prize and their decision will be final.
- The committee will not undertake or accept any responsibility for damage to, or loss of any exhibitor's property, but every reasonable care will be taken.
- Prize money may be claimed after 3:30pm on the day of the Show.
- Exhibits may not be removed until after the presentation of trophies on the day of the Show.
- All trophies to be returned to the Show Secretary in a good clean condition prior to the next Spring Show. Winners must sign a receipt for the trophies.
- The Committee reserves the right to decide all matters arising out of the Show which may not be specifically provided for in the foregoing regulations.
- Moss or grass is allowed as dressing on any classes.
- Wherever possible exhibits are judged on the basis of the rules of the Royal Horticultural Society, which, amongst other things, state that containers shall be of a plain standard type of the specified dimensions, giving no possible indication of the identity of the exhibitor. Likewise no garnishing or other trimming materials will be allowed other than those specified in the schedule. Any exhibit, which does not comply with these requirements, may not be judged and can be rejected on the grounds that it is "NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE".

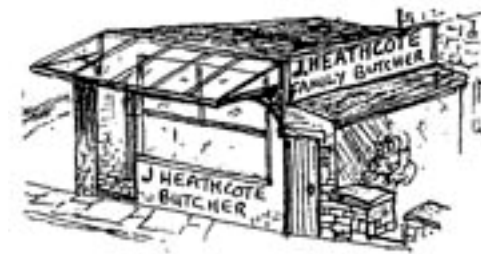

The following recipe must be used:-

- 8oz (200g) self raising flour
- 1tsp (5ml) mixed spice
- 5oz (125g) caster sugar
- 5oz (125g) margarine/butter
- 2 eggs
- 4-5 tbsp (80-100ml) milk
- 11oz (275g) mixed fruit

Method: Add the mixed spice to the flour and put to one side. Cream the margarine/butter with the sugar until light and fluffy. Add the eggs, one at a time, plus a little flour with the last egg to stop the mixture splitting. Fold in the remaining flour and fruit and add the milk to make a fairly soft mixture. Turn into a greased and lined 7 inch/17.5 cm cake tin. Bake in a pre-heated oven 150C/300F/Gas Mark2 for approximately 2 hours or until cooked.
